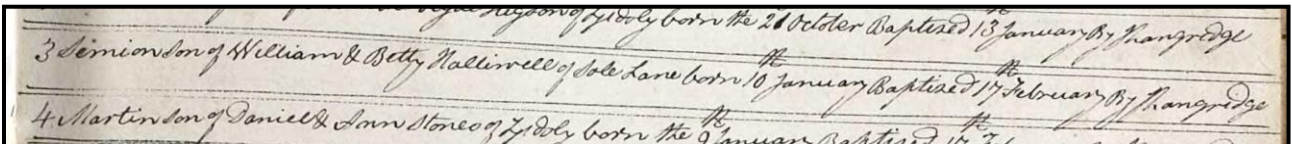

In 1869 and 1870, Simeon had to issue proceedings against two apprentices for absenting themselves from work. In both cases, the magistrates found in favour of Simeon. However, it is interesting to note that it was stated in court that Mr. Halliwell boarded some apprentices in his house and they paid a sum of 4s. per week.

The *Bolton Evening News* on 2 September 1873 reported:

**STEALING A HAND CART**

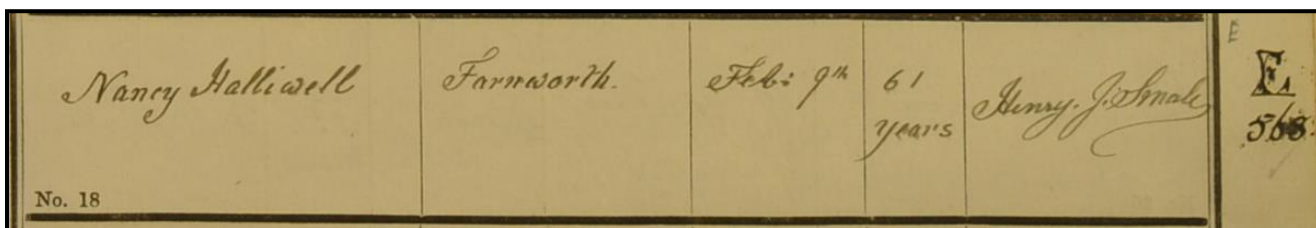
*At the County Sessions on Monday, a young man named Frank Moore was committed to the sessions for trial on a charge of having stolen a hand-cart, value £5, the property of Mr. Simeon Halliwell, wheelwright, Farnworth. The prisoner hired the cart from the wife of the prosecutor on the pretence of desiring to remove some furniture from his house in Gregg-street to Egerton Street. The truck was found have been sold to Mr. Atherton, painter, Bolton, for £1. In defence, the man said he was in want when he sold the truck, but was willing to have either restored the cart or to have paid for it if the prosecutor would have given him time.*

**Nancy**, his wife, died on 6 February 1893. However, within 3 months, Simeon had remarried.

Two public notices appeared in the *Manchester Courier* on 6 November 1895:

*SIMEON TWIST and JEFFREY TWIST are NO LONGER IN MY SERVICE, and have no authority to solicit orders or collect accounts on my behalf. (Signed) SIMEON HALLIWELL. November 5th, 1895.*

*Thanking numerous customers and friends for their kind support for the past years, and soliciting continuance of their favours, assuring them that shall continue to use my best endeavours to retain their confidence executing the best work reasonable charges, and by careful attention to all orders entrusted to my care.*
