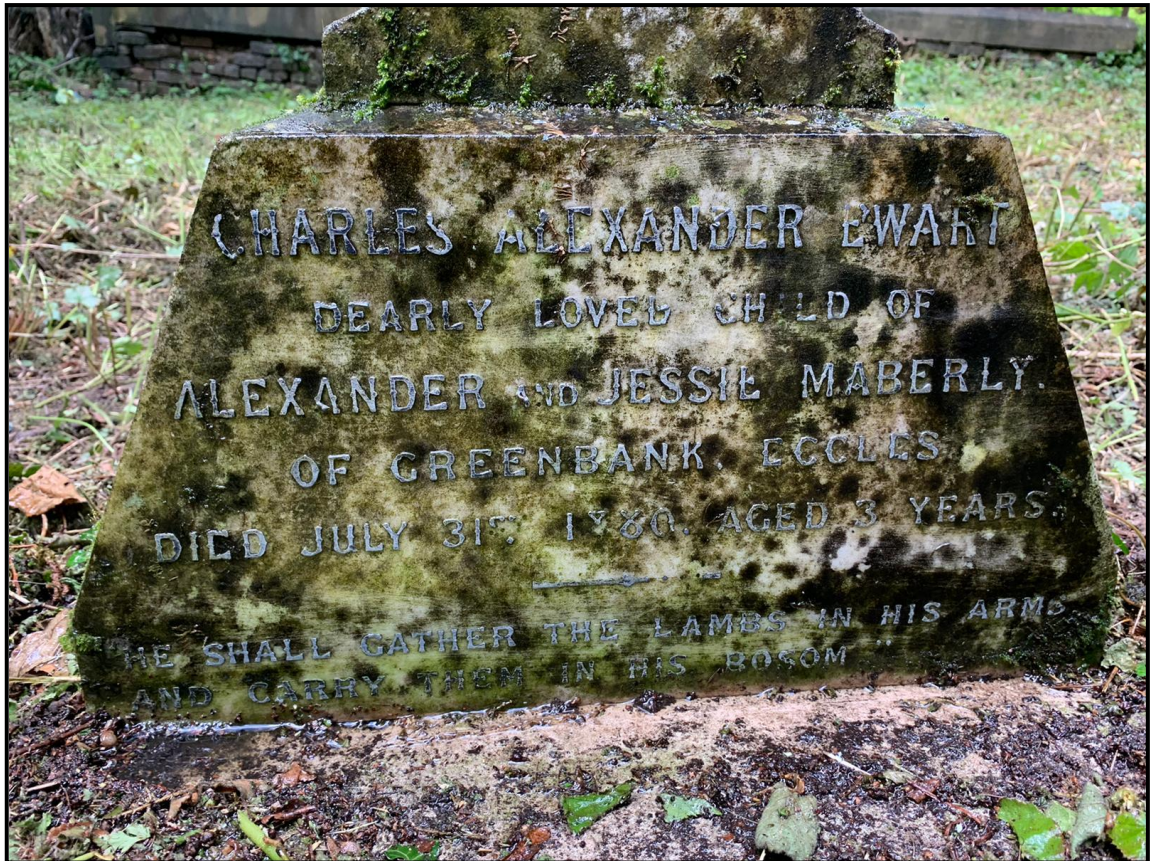

MABERLY. — On the 10th inst, at Greenbank, Eccles, Manchester, the wife of Alexander C. Maberly, Barrister-at-law, of a son. [This was Charles Alexander Ewart].

1880: Death of **Charles Alexander Ewart MABERLY** on 31 July 1880. Buried at St. Mark's on 5 August.

1866: 1 February - degree of B.A. conferred upon **Alexander C. Maberly** of Queen's College, Oxford.

1868: 14 May - **Alexander Cahill Maberly** was awarded a M.A. Degree at a Congregation.

1870: *University of Pennsylvania: Kislak Center for Special Collections, Rare Books and Manuscripts*

The travel diary written by Alexander Cahill Maberly is a single volume signed Alex C. Maberly spanning two months from August to October 1870. Maberly travelled through France, Switzerland, Germany, and Belgium. "Journal Dieppe, Août, 1870" is written on the first leaf of the volume, followed by quotations, and a photograph of four men. The photograph is captioned with each man's name: "Edward Hall, H. Mann, Richard Janion, and A.C.M" The four men journeyed together and Maberly mentions each of them in the journal. Maberly wrote of the Prussians advancing on France, observations of people, the hotels, letters he received, and expeditions on his journey. There are some small ink drawings Maberly employed to depict some of his descriptions.

1876: From the *Reading Mercury*, Saturday 12 February 1876:

Maberly - Ewart. On the 9th inst., at St. Mary's, Crumpsall, by the Very Rev. the Dean of Manchester, assisted by the Rev. Oswald T. Reichel, B.C.L., Vicar of Spersholt, Berks, and the Rev. Henry Cottam, Rector of St. Mary's, Alexander Cahill Maberly, M.A., Oxon, and of Lincoln's-inn, Barrister-at-law, to Jessie Bremner, daughter of the late Peter Ewart.

1877: From the *Morning Post* of Wednesday 13 June 1877:

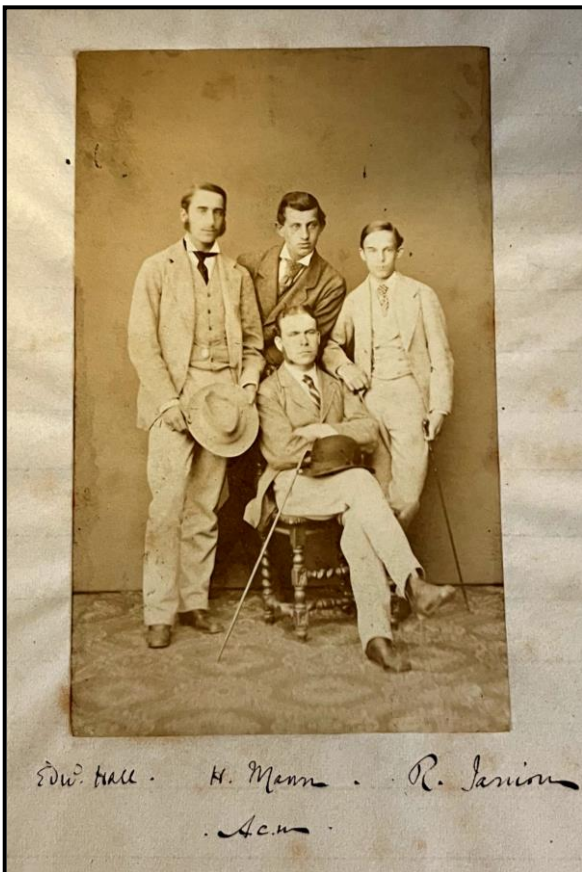
1919: From the *North Wales Chronicle and Advertiser* of 3 October **1919**:

A MANCHESTER BARRISTER'S DEATH

Mr. A. C. Maberly, a well-known barrister, and leader of the Manchester Chancery Bar, who has been suffering for the past six weeks from heart trouble, died at Llandrindod Wells at the age of 76.

He died on 30 September **1919** at 'Ye Wells Hotel.'
