

The Whitby Gazette on Saturday 18 August 1877 published some rare yet interesting information on its first page. There were 6 columns of people's names under the heading List of Visitors - people who were visiting the Whitby area and the places where they were staying. At Sandsend, about 4 miles north of Whitby on the coast, appears the information At Mrs. Collin's - Mr. Heber Derbyshire, Worsley. Interestingly, there were several people from Worsley staying in that area. Could it be that it was because it was the home of the second rector the Earl Mulgrave?

The Leigh Chronicle printed an interesting short article on Friday 6 December 1889 under the heading:

## Married Women's Tea Party at Boothstown

The married ladies attending Boothstown Church held tea party on Saturday evening in the school. There were large numbers at the tea which was thoroughly enjoyed. After tea, Mrs. Peel, of Drywood, presided, and gave a pithy address. The following programme was afterwards gone through: Song and chorus, the choir; song, Carrie Lee," Mrs. Miller; song, Those Chiming Bells of Long Ago," Mrs. Houghton; recitation. Airs. Carrington; song, Mrs. Heber Derbyshire; song, Call back again," Mrs. J. Aldred; duet, "Lightly Tread," Mrs. Led ward anil Mrs. Rigby: song, "Barney, take me home," Mrs. W. Hilton; dialogue, "Owd Crusty;" glee, "Mark the Merry Elves," the choir; song, Barney," Mia, Clare; song, "White Wings," Aim. Smith; recitation, "Crossing the River, Mrs. J. Hilton; song, Cottage by the Sex," Mrs. Lord; recitation, Mrs. Carrington; duet, "Hunting Tower," Alls. Lee and Mrs. Clare; dialogue, Toy Drinking;" song, "Some Folks," Mrs. Miller; song, "Riding on Loads of Hay," Mrs. Houghton; song, "Time may steal the Roses," Mrs. Clare; song, Somebody's waiting for me," Mrs. Aldred; Doxology. A vote of thanks was given by the President at the close. The proceeds amounted to £28.

### WORSLEY BOYS' SCHOOL.
