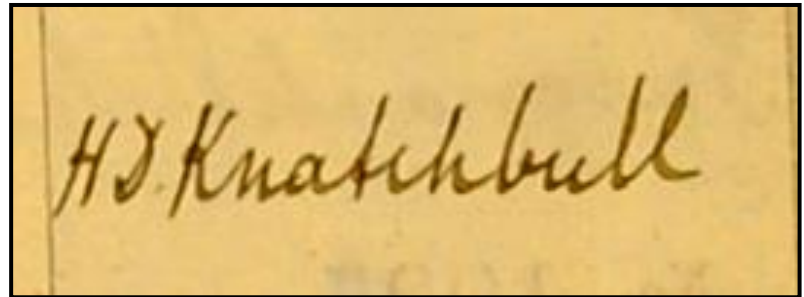
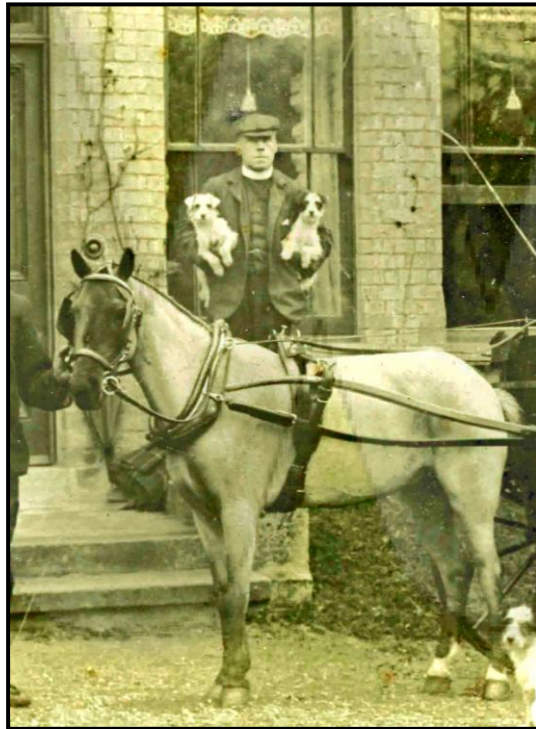

Cheswardine (Salop), Langley (Bucks.), and Hill Croome (Worcs.).

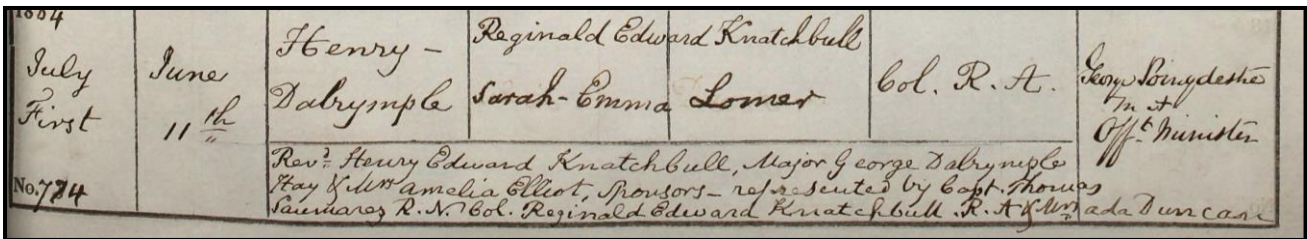

1894: departed from London on the ship *Oruba* for Sydney, Australia, on 6 April.

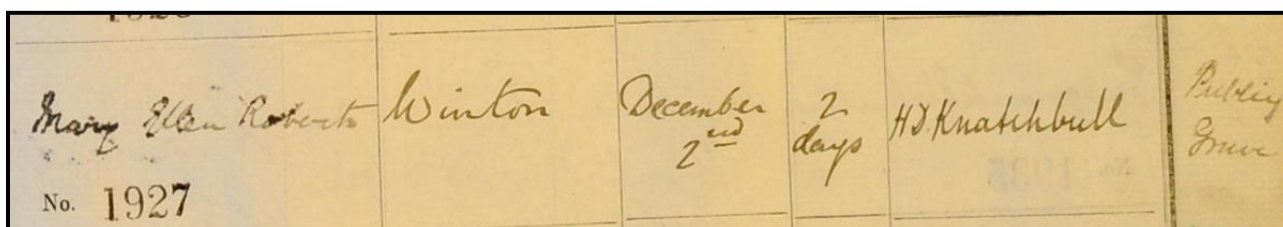
1895: By 1895, he was in Queensland, Australia where he was appointed Rector, first in the Downs, and then of St. Thomas's, Beaudesert.

1899: In April 1899, his mother visited him in Queensland, and shortly afterwards, in May, he returned to live in England, becoming curate of Langley.

*Our Beaudesert correspondent, writing on the 24th instant, says ...Bishop Webber arrived here this afternoon to induct the Rev. Mr. Coquette (who has recently arrived from England) as rector of St. Thomas's Church. There was a large congregation for the service and gathering afterwards in the parish room, where refreshments were served. Mr. Be Burgh Persse presented to the **Rev. Mr. Knatchbull** a framed address and a purse of sovereigns, and made a short speech in his praise and a regret at his departure. **Mr. Knatchbull** replied, and spoke very feelingly of his regret at leaving, and of the many kind friends he has made during the three years he had lived at Beaudesert, and said it was only duty which made him leave. He expressed a hope that they would rally round the new rector at once, not wait for him to make his personal influence felt. The Bishop then spoke very highly in praise of **Mr. Knatchbull** and the work he had done, and hoped that at some future time he would return to our shores and bring with him a few like himself. **Mr. Knatchbull** seemed very much affected. The sorrow at his leaving is felt by all his parishioners, who will long hold him in affectionate remembrance. He is to be presented with a souvenir at the School of Arts, Veresdale, on Tuesday evening, and leaves on Thursday to visit his former parishioners on the 'Downs, and sails from Sydney on the 13th of May.*

1889: His first service at St. Mark's was the burial of Mary Ellen Roberts, of Winton, who was buried in a public grave in the churchyard on 2 December 1889, aged 2 days.

*The Rev. **Henry D. Knatchbull**, B.A., formerly Curate of St. Clement's, Ordsal, Salford, and of St. Mark's, Worsley, has been appointed to the Stipendiary Curacy of the Parish Church of Berkhamstead,*

1902: Appointed Sheriff's Chaplain in Buckinghamshire and assistant curate of Langley, Bucks.

1902: *Cambridge Independent Press* Friday 27 June 1902. Appointment of the **Rev. H. D. Knatchbull**, as Vicar of Caxton, Cambridge, preferment being given him by the Marquis of Normanby.

1902: On 16 September he married Cecilia Maud Woodhouse, at Eton. She died on 21 January 1947.



*On the 16th inst.. at St Mary's Church. Bucks., the marriage took place of the Rev. **Henry Dalrymple Knatchbull** of Caxton. Cambridgeshire, second son of the late Lieutenant-General R. E. Knatchbull. R. A. (late of Claremont Court, Jersey), with Cecilia Maud, youngest daughter of the late Samuel Woodhouse, J.P., DL., of Morley Hall, Cheshire.*

MARRIAGE OF THE HIGH SHERIFF'S CHAPLAIN.

*A fashionable wedding took place at the grand old church of St, Mary's. Langley, on Tuesday afternoon, when the **Rev. H. D. Knatchbull**, Chaplain to the High Sheriff of Buckinghamshire, was married to Miss Cecilia Maud Woodhouse, of Langley Furze. The bridegroom is the second son of the late Lieut. - General Knatchbull. R.A.. and the bride the youngest daughter of the late Mr. Samuel J.P.. D.L.. of Norley Hall, Cheshire. The bridegroom was curate of Langley for about two and half years, and was very popular with the parishioners. He left on his appointment as Vicar of Caxton, Cambridge, preferment being given him by the Marquis of Normanby. His best man was the Rev. T. Burnett, and the bride was given away by her eldest brother, Major Woodhouse. She was attired in a dress of white chiffon over Liberty satin, trimmed with real Limerick and Brussels lace, with a plain tulle veil and wreath of orange blossoms, a spray of the same flowers being on her bodice. Her ornaments were diamond stars, and she carried a lovely shower bouquet. The choir met the bridal procession at the west door and proceeded up the nave, singing. "O God our help in ages past." The ceremony was performed by the Rev. W. Francis, assisted by the Rev. H. R. Whitehead, Vicar of Warminster. Psalm 67 was rendered, and the hymn "Love Divine, all loves excelling." was sung, after which the Rev. H. R. Whitehead gave a suitable address. The Benediction having been pronounced, the service concluded with the hymn "Come. Gracious Spirit, heavenly Dove." The presents were numerous and handsome. Among the guests invited were Sir Robert Harvey. Bart., Lady Harvey, the High Sheriff of Bucks and Mrs. Lloyd, Mr. and Mrs. Pearce Serocold, Mr. and Mrs. Carr Gomm, Mr. and Mrs. de Lisle. Mr. and Mrs. Dent. Mr. and Mrs Hartopp Nash, and Mr. and Mrs. Wollaston, etc (South Bucks Standard - Friday 19 September 1902)*

*New Pulpit - April 11th, the vicar of Caxton (the **Rev. H. D. Knatchbull**) dedicated in the Parish Church a carved pulpit which has been presented by Miss Jessie Smythe in memory of her father and mother. Her father, Rev. H. M Smythe, was Vicar of Caxton for 29 years and died in 1902.*

1906: On 1 July, birth of Ursula.

At a meeting of the Hartley Wintney Union, the **Rev. H.D. Knatchbull** was voted by the Board of Guardians to become the Chaplain to the Winchfield Workhouse. In his application statement, he wrote that he had recently accepted the living of Winchfield.




