



Married **Beatrice Robinson** at the Congregational Church, Leigh, on 14 March **1910**.

Attestation of Harold Whitehead on 14 April 1915, on the eve of his 25<sup>th</sup> His birthday. address was 129 Manchester Road, Leigh, and he was married by this time, to Beatrice, They had 3 children, Bessie, James and Margaret. He was discharged after 39 days from the 10<sup>th</sup> South Lancs. Regt. He was recommended for discharge because of an old fracture of the upper end of the right femur, which meant that his right leg was 1.5 inches shorter than his left leg, and was therefore incapable of long marches or prolonged drill.


