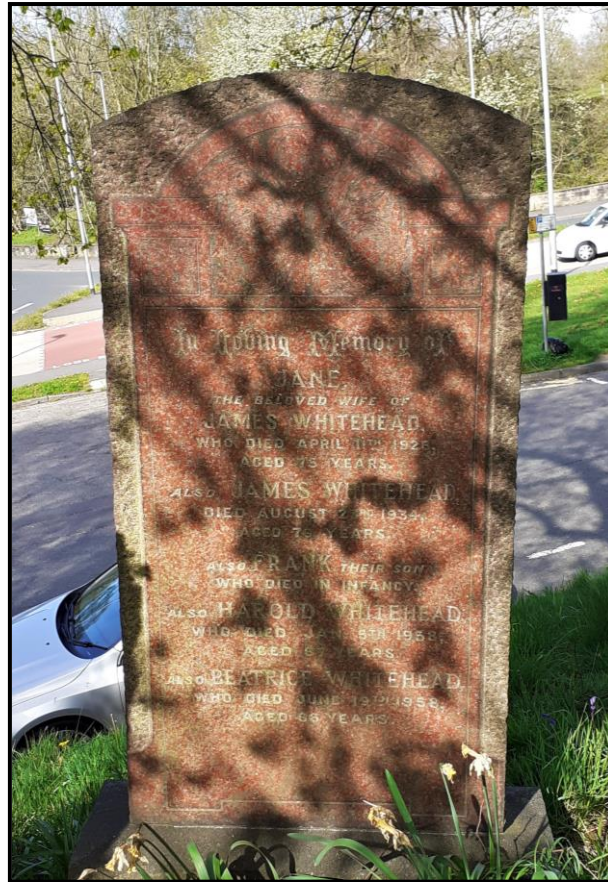

WHITEHEAD James of 88 Manchester-road Leigh **Lancashire** died 23 August 1934 Probate **London** 22 September to William Smith colliery fireman and Peter Mansley commercial traveller. Effects £240 5s. 6d.

Harold WHITEHEAD

Born on 15 April 1890.



Married **Beatrice Robinson** at the Congregational Church, Leigh, on 14 March 1910.

Attestation of Harold Whitehead on 14 April 1915, on the eve of his 25th birthday. His address was 129 Manchester Road, Leigh, and he was married by this time, to Beatrice. They had 3 children, Bessie, James and Margaret. He was discharged after 39 days from the 10th South Lancs. Regt. He was recommended for discharge because of an old fracture of the upper end of the right femur, which meant that his right leg was 1.5 inches shorter than his left leg, and was therefore incapable of long marches or prolonged drill.

In the 1939 Register, his occupation was given as 'Colliery Service Hand Work', now living at 235 Chapel Street, Leigh, with Beatrice, Alice and Marian.

1958: Death of **Harold Whitehead**, aged 67, on 5 January 1958, and buried at St. Mark's on 9 January.

8. Are you willing to be vaccinated or re-vaccinated? Yes
9. Are you willing to be enlisted for General Service? Yes
10. Did you receive a Notice, and do you understand its meaning, and who gave it to you? Yes (Name Harold Whitehead Corps 10th South Lancs)
11. Are you willing to serve upon the following conditions provided His Majesty should so long require your services? Yes

For the duration of the War, at the end of which you will be discharged with all convenient speed. If employed with Hospitals, depots of Mounted Units, and as Clerks, etc., you may be retained after the termination of hostilities until your services can be spared, but such retention shall in no case exceed six months.

I, Harold Whitehead, do solemnly declare that the above answers made by me to the above questions are true, and that I am willing to fulfil the engagements made.

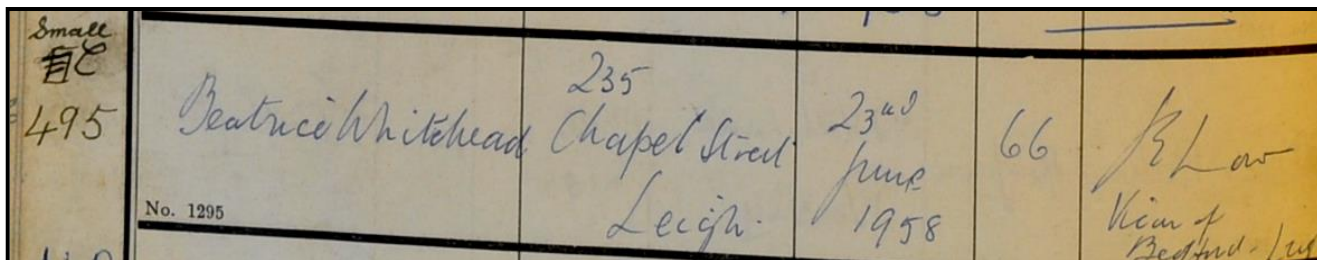
