A SAVAGE DOG AT LARGE

Cobb v. Gradiski. - This was an action in which Caroline Cobb, by her next friend, Charles Robert Cobb, of 31, Howard-street, Eccles New-road, Salford, sued Charles Thomas Ingete Gradiski, grocer, living at 29, Howard-street, for £50 for injuries received by the child from the bite of a dog belonging to the defendant. Mr. Smyly appeared for the plaintiff, and Mr. Lowe for the defendant.

Mr. Smyly, In opening the case, said the little child was a girl of about seven years of age, and on July 9 she, in company with other children, was playing near the defendant's house, when, suddenly, the defendant's dog, which was a large black Newfoundland, sprang over a short wall in front of the defendant's house, ran down the street, and seized the child, and began worrying her. A painter named Christopher Monks, who was engaged on his ladder painting some houses near, saw the occurrence and called to a man named John Hurst, who was near. Hurst turned round and saw several children running away screaming; he also a dog tearing what he thought was some clothing that it had snatched from one of the children and, thinking it was undesirable to allow the dog to destroy the clothes, he went up to drive it off, when, to his horror, found that instead its being bundle of clothes that the dog was biting it was a child. He immediately seized hold of the railings of the garden and commenced kicking the dog, and after a great deal of trouble succeeded in driving it off. He picked up the child and found it was covered with blood. The child was attended by a surgeon who cauterised the wounds that were upon its neck, face and body. The face of the child was permanently disfigured. The dog on previous occasions had bitten people, and Mr. Gradiski had frequently had complaints made to him of the savageness of the animal, and he also was well aware of the fact that the dog had bitten people. Mr. Smyly then called evidence which bore out his opening.

Jane Rogers deposed to having been bitten in the wrist by the dog, and to Mr. Gradiski being aware of the fact. The defendant denied knowing that the dog had ever bitten anyone or that it was a savage animal.

His Honour gave a verdict for the plaintiff for £30 and costs.

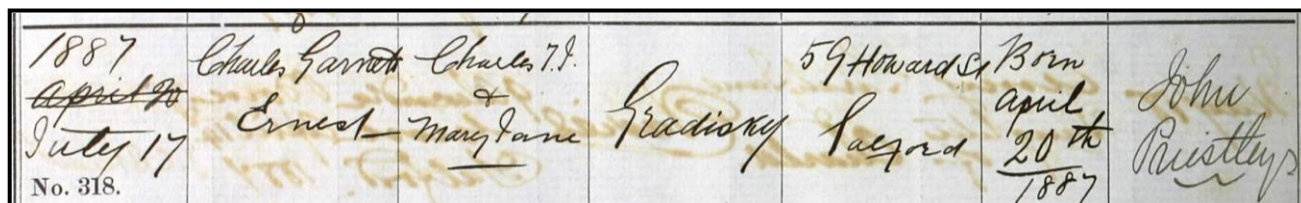

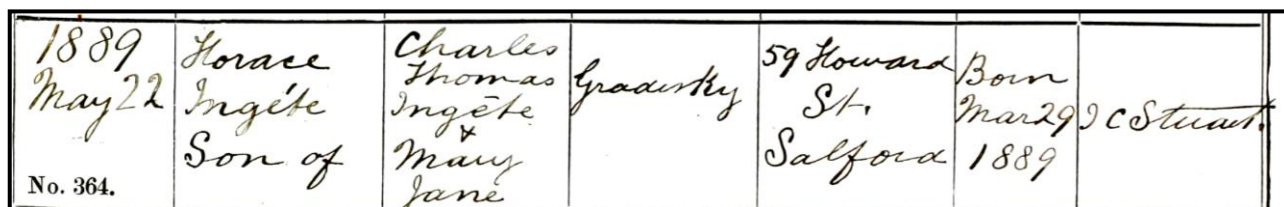

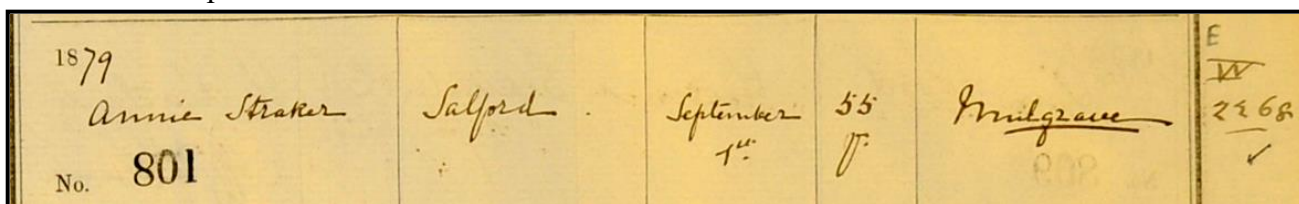
