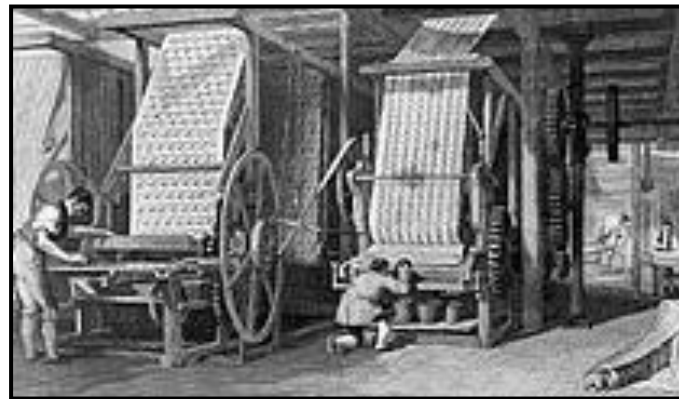

1837: *The Manchester Courier* Saturday 27 May **1837:**

SALFORD INTERMEDIATE SESSION.

The general intermediate session for the hundred of Salford was opened on Monday, before James Norris, Esq., chairman, J. Watkins, S. Philips, J. J. Norreys, J. F. Foster, S. Fletcher, Robert Darbyshire, J. B. Smith, Esqs., and the Rev. T. S. Mills. The following gentlemen were sworn of the grand jury :—

1843: *The Manchester Courier* Saturday 4 November **1843:**

WEEKLY HALF HOLIDAY IN WAREHOUSES.

We, the undersigned Bankers. Merchants, Manufacturers, and Calico Printers, of Manchester, at the respectful solicitation of those in our employment, agree to Close our Places of Business at One o'Clock every Saturday Afternoon, commencing the fourth day of November instant (this day); and to allow our servants leave for the day, as shortly after that hour as the unavoidable exigencies of business will permit, provided the arrangement can be made general. In acceding to the request of our assistants, we are influenced by a desire to promote their interests and comfort, and do it in the expectation that, according to the representations made to us, the leisure thus afforded them will be devoted to beneficial pursuits.

This agreement carried the signatures of several businessmen, including **Richard Hutchinson**.

1857: *The Manchester Courier* Saturday 10 January 1857:

POULTON-LE-FYLDE. - Mr. J. McPherson, late Principal of Brunswick Lodge Academy, Pendleton, Manchester, begs to intimate that he has REMOVED to POULTON-LE-FYLDE, near Blackpool, where he will (d.v.) OPEN a BOARDING SCHOOL for a limited number of Young Gentlemen, on the 26th inst. Terms, including French, from 40 to 45 guineas per annum, according to age. The number pupils is limited to twenty.

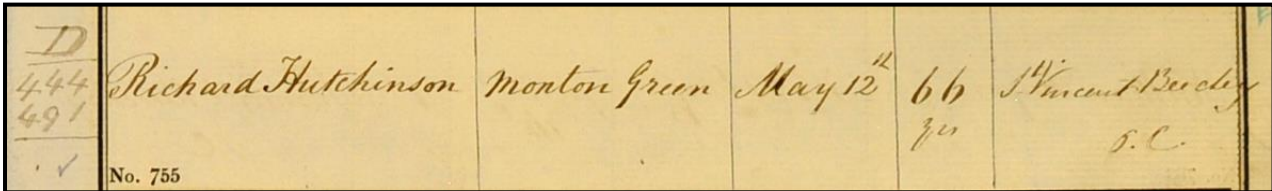

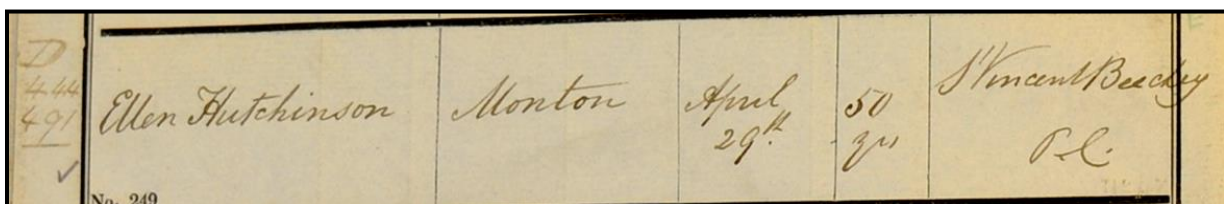
