A SURGEON AND TWO ATTENDANTS POISONED AT THE MANCHESTER WORKHOUSE. CHARGE OF WILFUL MURDER AGAINST THE HEAD NURSE.

An extraordinary poisoning case was on Thursday morning brought before the Manchester City Police Court. Hannah Steele, head nurse of the lunatic ward of the Manchester Workhouse, was charged with having caused the death of Mr. Andrew Harris, the senior resident medical officer, and also with having poisoned two attendants. The case was remanded for a week.

THE CHARGE OF POISONING A WORK. HOUSE SURGEON.

Hannah Steele was tried at the Manchester assize on Wednesdav on the charge of murdering **Andrew Harris**, surgeon, at the Workhouse Hospital, by putting poison in the milk he had with his tea on the morning of the 10th January. The trial lasted all day, but the evidence only amounted to suspicion. She had not served his breakfast, and the suspicion was mainly founded on the fact that had reported. her to the guardians for neglecting to report a new case of insanity in the hospital, and caused her to be reprimanded after which she had said she would give him reporting enough. The jury, after ten pronounced_a verdict of acquittal.


THE MANCHESTER POISONING CASE.

Hannah Steele, formerly a nurse in the Manchester workhouse hospital, was tried at the Manchester Assizes on Wednesday for the murder of Mr. Andrew Harris, for some years medical officer at the workhouse. The deceased undoubtedly died from the effect of poison, and it was charged against the prisoner that she had put a quantity of atropia into his food on the morning of the 10th January. After a long investigation the Jury acquitted the prisoner.

The death of Dr. John Doxon Ward took place on Sunday, at his residence, No. 10. Upper Choritonroad. Dr. Ward became a licentiate of the Society of Apothecaries as far back as 1851, after receiving his training at the Royal School of Medicine, founded in Manchester in 1824. In 1858 he obtained the distinctions of M.D. of Aberdeen University and M.R.C.S. of England. He entered the volunteer service as surgeon of the old 40th Lancashire R.V.. and retired many years afterwards as Surgeon-major 4th V.B. Manchester Regiment. Dr. Ward was the author of an important contribution to one of the journals of the faculty on "Rupture of the heart by external violence without breach of skin."
