




According the engraving on the gravestone, **Reginald Benson** was the grandson of Henry Albert BENSON, and the son of Percy and Clara Benson, of Rossington, Yorkshire. He died, aged 19 years, on 22 October **1942.** He died as a result of a flying accident. However, according to official records of his death and of the accident, he was 21 years. At that time, he was serving with 267 squadron in Egypt. Official documents show that he was buried at Heliopolis War Cemetery and his body lies in Row 2. A. 28. His service number was 572958. All occupants were aboard a Lockheed Lodestar II, registration EW984. The circumstances of the accident were as follows:

Narrative:

The Lodestar took off from Bilbeis, Egypt, on a passenger flight to Lydda, Israel. Shortly after becoming airborne the pilot began to perform passes over Bilbeis Camp. He made a run at the Officers' Mess tent at a reported height of 8 feet. The left wing-tip of the Lodestar struck the tent and broke away causing the plane to roll inverted and crash, bursting into flames. All on board (3 crew and 10 passengers) lost their lives.



On board officially were 3 crew and 10 passengers. The report stated that the aircraft was destroyed and damaged beyond repair. The name of Cpl. **Reginald Benson** is to be found on the C. W. G. C. website. On the gravestone are the words:

'Worthy of everlasting remembrance'
