1882: *Preston Herald* – Wednesday 7 June **1882**.

Ordinations at Manchester: The Lord Bishop of Manchester held an ordination at the Cathedral and Parish Church, Manchester, on Sunday when the following candidates were ordained: [inter al.]. . . .

Thomas Henry Davies, *St. Aidan's Theological College, Birkenhead*, (passed the Oxford and Cambridge preliminary examination), licensed to *St. Mary's, Preston*.

1883: *Manchester Courier* – Wednesday 31 October **1883**.

The Rev. Thomas Henry Davies, Curate of *St. Mary's, Preston*, has been appointed by the trustees of the patronage to the new district of Ribbleton, near Preston, but being in deacon's orders only cannot be licensed to that incumbency until he is ordained priest on Trinity Sunday next.

1884: *Montgomeryshire Express* – Tuesday 8 January **1884**.

Presentation to a Townsman. - At the annual congregational tea party and entertainment of the *St. Mary's Church, Preston*, held on Thursday evening, the chairman, the Rev G. Alker, vicar of the parish, presented the **Rev. T. H. Davies** with a valuable gold watch, as a token of affectionate regard in leaving the parish. The rev. gentleman accepted the gift in suitable terms.

Manchester Courier – Monday 25 February **1884**.

Mr. W. Farrer Ecroyd, M.P., has consented to lay the foundation stone, at Easter, of a new schoolchurch at Ribbleton, near Preston. On the completion of the structure it will be used for the performance of divine service until the erection of the new church, for which plans have been prepared by Messrs. Garlick, Park, and Sykes, of Preston. The patronage will be vested in five trustees (one of whom is the Bishop of Manchester), the **Rev. T. H. Davies** being in charge of the district.

1886: *Preston Herald* – Saturday 9 January 1886.

The newspaper reported on a festive parish tea held in the school hall the previous Thursday. A number of people held trays to collect subscriptions for a testimonial to the **Rev. T. H. Davies**. At the interval, the Archdeacon presented to the Rev. Davies a purse of 20 sovereigns and a framed an illuminated address:

To the Rev. T. H. Davies - Dear Mr. Davies, In grateful recognition of what you have done for parish and of your devotion in your sacred duties, the accompanying offering of twenty guineas is made by the undersigned parishioners, and other friends, in real sorrow that they lose the privilege of your continued ministry. They hope that this address may always find a place in your home, and help to keep green in your memory the names of those whose joys you have shared, and with whose sorrows you have never failed to sympathise, during the time you have been with them. You will take with you the esteem and regret of all, with their most earnest wishes for your future prosperity and happiness.

In his reply, The Rev. T. H. Davies thanked everyone for their present and for arranging the tea and concert. He spoke of *'the warm place that Grimsargh would always hold in his heart. He thanked for the way they had always helped him and co-operated with him, and said that he did not believe that since came among them - nearly two years ago – he had over asked anyone for help in vain. He had had a difficult - in many ways a very difficult position- to fill, and thanked thorn all for the way they had helped him in his work.*




By 1919, the Rev. was still Vicar of Barton, and then until 1926.
