Bonnet Hall was demolished around the mid-1950s as it was no longer fit for habitation. It stood at the corner of Walkden Road and Greenleach lane.

One lady, named Betty, wrote in 2009, "*Bonnet Hall is where I lived from c.1947-1951 with my parents & brother.*"

The property was divided into 4 & was on the corner of Greenleach Lane Worsley. We lived in No.6, my Gran & Aunt lived in No 2. I think they were there from about 1939".

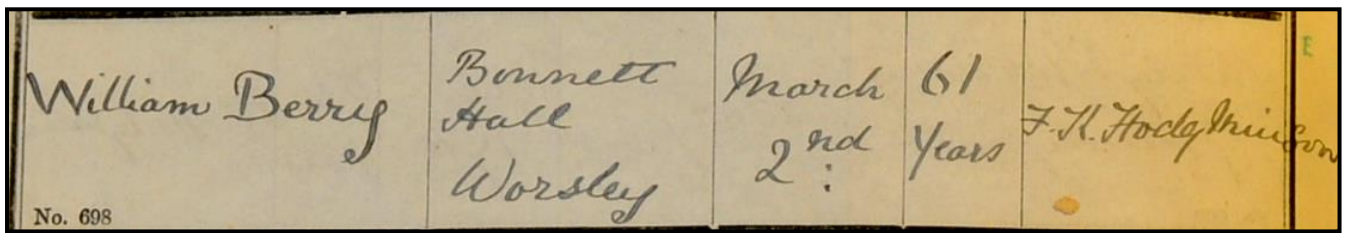

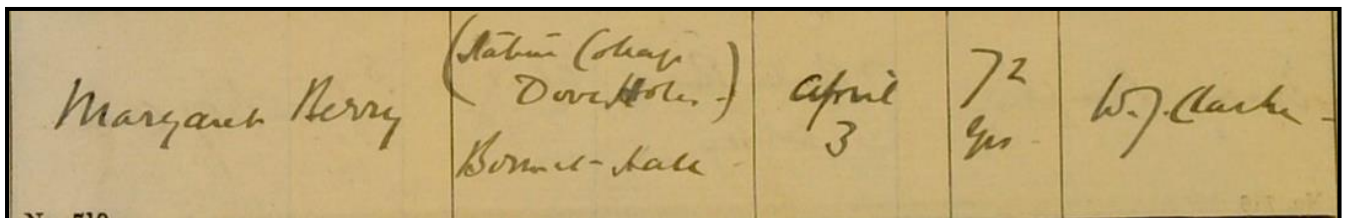


The WILL of **William Berry** shows that he resided on Walkden Road, Worsley, and that he was a Boat Builder. He died on 27 February **1900**. Probate was granted to James Thomas Smith Berry, station-master. His effects were £122 16s.
