1875: Marriage on 5 August to **Mary Ann Greenwood** (21) at St. Thomas, Heaton Chapel. This appears to be a second marriage. John Moore was a Widower, and a Machinery Merchant - but why was he given as 21???? In both cases, this was the age given. However, records show that Mary Ann was a little older than that. Furthermore, 21 was accepted as the legal age and was often written as *Of Full Age*. In this instance, the minimum legal age seems to have been applied. His father was James Moore, Gentleman, and her father was Whiteley Greenwood, Merchant. Following on from this, There was a son James (after his grandfather); his second name was Whiteley (his mother's maiden name); John was a Machinery Merchant (see the 1881 census).

- 1877:** Birth of Marion Moore on 9 December. Baptised on 28 February 1878 at St. Mary, Eccles.
- 1879:** Baptism of James Whiteley Moore on 7 August at St. Mary, Eccles.
- 1881:** Birth of John Ernest Moore on 3 September 1881. Baptism on 22 April 1882 at St. Mary, Eccles.

Each of these children was born to **John** and **Mary Ann**. In each case, John was a Machinery Merchant.

Mary Ann MOORE

The daughter of Whiteley Greenwood, **Mary Ann Greenwood** was born on 1 January **1851** and baptised on 24 February 1851 at Manchester Cathedral. Her father was a Fustian Manufacturer.

1851 census: 3 months old, living at 2 Dale Street, Manchester, with Whitley and Ann Greenwood.

1861 census: Aged 10 years, at 13 Stanley Street, Manchester, with her parents.

1871 census: Aged 20 years, at 281 York Street, Manchester, with her parents.

THE WILL OF MR. WHITELEY GREENWOOD.

Probate has been granted of the will (dated December 13th, 1886) of Mr. Whiteley Greenwood, of 22, Church-street, Manchester; and Peel-terrace, Stretford, who died on the 24th February, and whose personal estate was declared of the value of £61,922. by the executors, Walter Goodbrand, the son-in-law, and George Barlow Thorp, of Church-street, Manchester. The testator leaves his household furniture and other effects, his farm and lands at Hudson Fold, Heptonstall, Yorkshire, and his business, with the stock-in-trade thereof as a fustian merchant in Manchester, to his son John Greenwood absolutely, and leaves in trust £15,000 to pay the income therefrom to him for his life, with remainder to his children. The testator gives to his daughter Mrs. Elizabeth Goodbrand, the income from eight leasehold houses in Elizabeth-street, Cheetham, and the income from £15,000; and he leaves for his daughter, Mrs. Mary Ann Moore, the income from six leasehold houses in Peel-terrace, Stretford, and from a sum of £15,000, with remainder to her children. The residue of his estate the testator devises and bequeaths to his son John Greenwood.

At the time of her marriage in **1875**, she would have been 24.

She had an older sister Elizabeth who married Walter Goodbrand, both of whom in turn were also buried at St. Mark's (q.v.). The will of Whiteley Greenwood (right) shows that he left (in 1886) an income for **Mary Ann** from 6 leasehold houses in Stretford.
