William Cherry was born in the third quarter of **1843** in Bury Registration District. His parents, **John Cherry** and **Sarah** (née **Chaliner**) were married at St. Mary, Prestwich, on 28 June **1835**. **John** died in Prestwich in **1888** and **Sarah** in Bury in **1872**. Strangely, no evidence has been found of either William's baptism or that of his siblings.

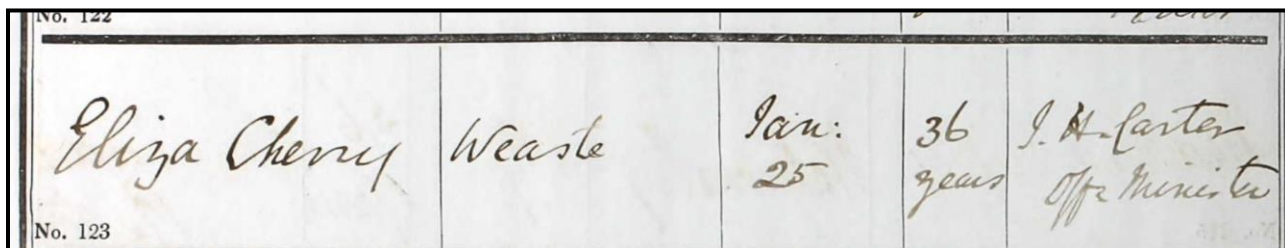

CHERRY William of Spring Clough Broad Oak Park Worsley Lancashire died 10 January 1908 Probate **London** 11 March to Eliza Ellen Cherry widow and John William Cherry mill manager. Effects £84478 19s. 8d. Resworn £84718 19s. 8d.

His interest in local politics took root in the mid 1880's. There are several instances of him attending local selection committees, nominating councillors and chairing meetings. On Monday 6 December 1886, *The Manchester Courier* reported:

MR. LEES-KNOWLES, M.P., WEST SALFORD.

*The growth of Conservative principles in West Salford has just received another illustration. A new club has been established at the west end of Liverpool Street, in Seedley Ward, for the purpose of uniting the Conservatives of the district, the spread of political knowledge, and the upholding of constitutional principles, and the opening ceremony took place on Saturday. The club is called "The St. Ambrose Conservative Working Men's Club." Mr. Lees-Knowles is the president. The chair was occupied by **Mr. William Cherry**.*

At the instigation of Lord Derby, an invitation was sent to the Duke and Duchess of York from the Mayor of Salford to secure a royal visit on the occasion of the opening of the Technical School on Wednesday 25 March 1896. A meeting of the Town Council was held on Friday 28 February "to consider generally as to the best means of rendering a loyal and hearty welcome to their Royal Highnesses the Duke and Duchess of York, on their visit to Salford". The Council received an immediate acceptance. The Mayor did not want the expense to fall upon the rates, but did agree that he and the Mayoress "would be happy to bear the expense of the banquet and any subsequent entertainments". He invited "the members of the Council, the magistrates and the chief residents to undertake the responsibility of decorating the route of the procession". **William Cherry** was elected to a sub-committee to collect funds and to join the committee of 8 of the Council to carry out the decorations.

The *Manchester Courier* on Saturday 18 May 1901 reported that on the previous Tuesday the name of **William Cherry**, and others, was placed on the Commission of Peace for the Borough of Salford.

His death was announced on Monday 13 January **1908** in the Manchester Courier:

DEATHS

*CHERRY. On the 10th inst., at his residence, Spring Clough, Worsley, **William Cherry** in his 65th year. Interment at St. Mark's Church, Worsley, on Wednesday, at 2.45, cortege leaving the residence at 2.15. All inquiries to be made to Messrs. Kendal, Milne and Co.*

Two weeks after his death, the Borough Justices passed a vote of condolence with the family of the late **Mr. William Cherry**.
