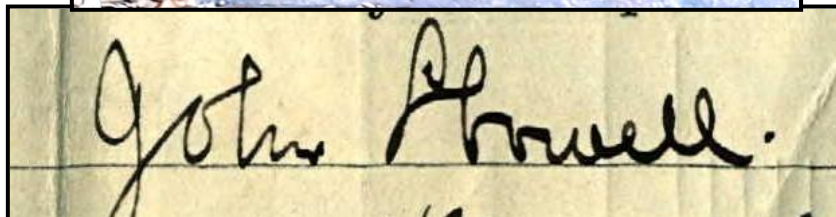

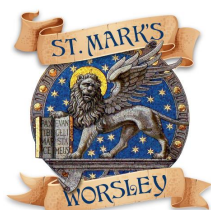

SERVICE RECORDS

Given that he was born early in 1867, it is a puzzle that **John HOWELL**'s name appears in war records for World War 1. They show that he was indeed a Sergeant in the King's Own Loyal Lancaster Regiment and his service number was 4384. The years refer to 1914-1923 and his name appears in the WW1 Pensions Ledgers and Index. His residence was given as Worsley, Lancs.



George HOWELL, the son, served in World War 1. He was a Lance Corporal in the 6th Battalion Gordon Highlanders. George died on 23 November **1917** and the records show that his death was accepted on that date. He qualified for 2 war medals – Victory and British. His effects of £6/0s/2d were paid to his widow Mary Ann. His regimental number was 201603.

The records of the C.W.G.C. show that his name appears on the Cambrai Memorial in northern France, on Panel 10 (out of 13 within the semi-circular colonnade). He is recorded as the son of

John Howell, of 15 Barton Road, Worsley, Manchester, and husband of Mary A. The Cambrai Memorial commemorated more than 7,000 servicemen of the U.K. who died in the Battle of Cambrai in November and December 1917 and whose graves are not known.
