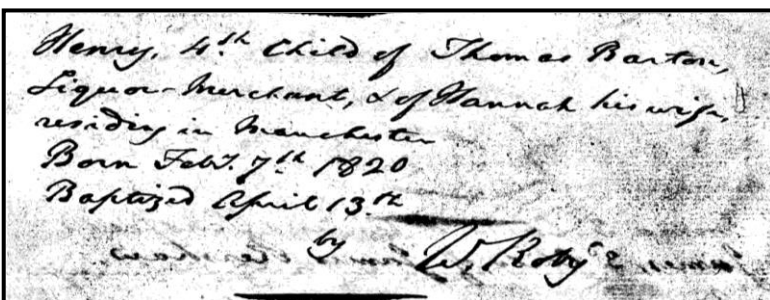

The *London Gazette* of 13 May **1859** announced that the partnership between Benjamin Love and Henry Barton, stationers, printers & booksellers, of Manchester, had been dissolved. Then, on Monday 9 January **1860**, the *Glasgow Herald* ran this advertisement:

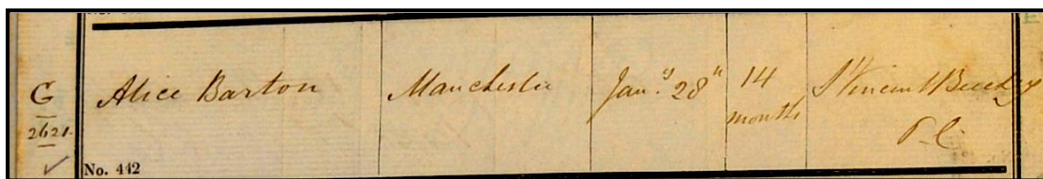
WANTED, for a Shipper's Office in Manchester, 27, a respectably connected YOUNG MAN who is a fair Penman, Accountant, and has some knowledge of Books and Goods, to make himself generally useful, but more particularly as Assistant Correspondent. Address, with sufficient particulars to save unnecessary communications, also what salary would be expected, to Y. Z., care of Mr. Henry Barton, Stationer, Manchester.

A further notice then appeared in the *Manchester Courier* on Saturday 19 September **1863**, and ran for a further six weeks:

*DESPATCH SOXES, WRITING DESKS, DRESSING CASES, &c, in Wood and Leather.
HENRY BARTON, Stationer, 70, Market-street.*

Indeed, hundreds of advertisement appeared in the Manchester newspapers for his products and services, through to the year of his death, **1885**. One such appeared on 6 January **1885** in the *Manchester Courier*:

This is another example of a respectable family who had no connection with the parish of St. Mark choosing to be buried here. No evidence has been found of them either living near to or worshipping at the church. All the children were baptised in Chorlton and Emily was married at St. Peter, Levenshulme. The family lived for many years in central Manchester.
