

DEATH OF MAJOR WADDINGTON.

The melancholy announcement we make this morning of the death of Mr. Jonathan Waddington, of Ellesmere Park, Eccles, will be read with much regret by the large circle of friends he possessed in Wigan, his native town. Generally of robust health, and full of animation, his death will appear exceedingly sudden to those who hare been unacquainted with the fact that for some weeks Mr. Waddington had been ailing, and even amongst his most intimate friends there was not until Wednesday last - the day of his decease - any serious anticipation that the complications of illness from which he was suffering would terminate fatally. The deceased gentleman was the elder son of Mr. Robert Waddington, of Wigan, and on Tuesday attained his sixtieth year. He was articled as an engineer to the Messrs. Daglish, of St. Helens, but did not long follow his profession, for, marrying Miss Moore, daughter of Mr. Moore, iron merchant, of Manchester, he entered into partnership with his father-in-law, and they erected the Ellesmere Mills at Patricroft, ever since carried on by the firm of Moore and Waddington. Mr. William Waddington, younger brother of the deceased, joined the concern subsequently, and now is the only representative of the partnership. Mr. Jonathan Waddington was an active public man at Patricroft, had served on the Board of Guardians, was one of the first members of the Barton Local Board, and at the time of his death was chairman, but it is in connection with the volunteer movement that he will be best remembered in this locality. He was one the first volunteers enrolled at Eccles, and for short time served in the ranks, but he was soon promoted, and eventually became captain of the corps. To great extent, through his exertions, the Wigan detachment, whose connection for battalion purposes with the Bury Volunteers was exceedingly inconvenient, was made part of the 4th Administrative Battalion; and when he attained his majority, several years ago, he was, as he always said, particularly fortunate in being attached the right half battalion composed chiefly of men belonging to the town in which he was born. For many years he was president of the mess, and in this capacity his genial and kindly disposition was abundantly manifested. Although, as he often said, his active volunteering days were nearly over, there is no one man in the battalion whose death would make a greater gap, and by a multitude of friends the sometimes brusque but good-hearted major will be sincerely regretted and lamented. Mr. Waddington's wife pre-deceased him; but he leaves a daughter married, and a son in

South Africa. The flag at the Eccles Town Hall is half-mast. The funeral is to take place on Monday at Worsley Church

The Late Major Waddington. The funeral of the late Major Jonathan Waddington will take place to-day at Worsley, whence the remains will be conveyed from the deceased's residence at Ellesmere Villa, Ellesmere Park, Eccles, and interred in the grave where the late Mrs. Waddington was buried. The funeral, in concurrence with the wishes of the family, will be strictly private, and there will be no military display.


The Late Major Waddington. On Saturday morning the remains of Major Jonathan Waddington, of the L.R.V., who died at his residence, Ellesmere Villa, Ellesmere Park, Eccles, on the previous Thursday morning from blood poisoning, were interred in the family vault, situate on the north-east side of Worsley churchyard. The service was taken by the Rev. Canon Pitcairn, Vicar of Eccles and rural dean. Notwithstanding the announcement that the funeral would be strictly private one, the churchyard was filled with hundreds of persons, amongst whom were large circle of friends, and also employees of deceased at Ellesmere Mills, Patricroft.


