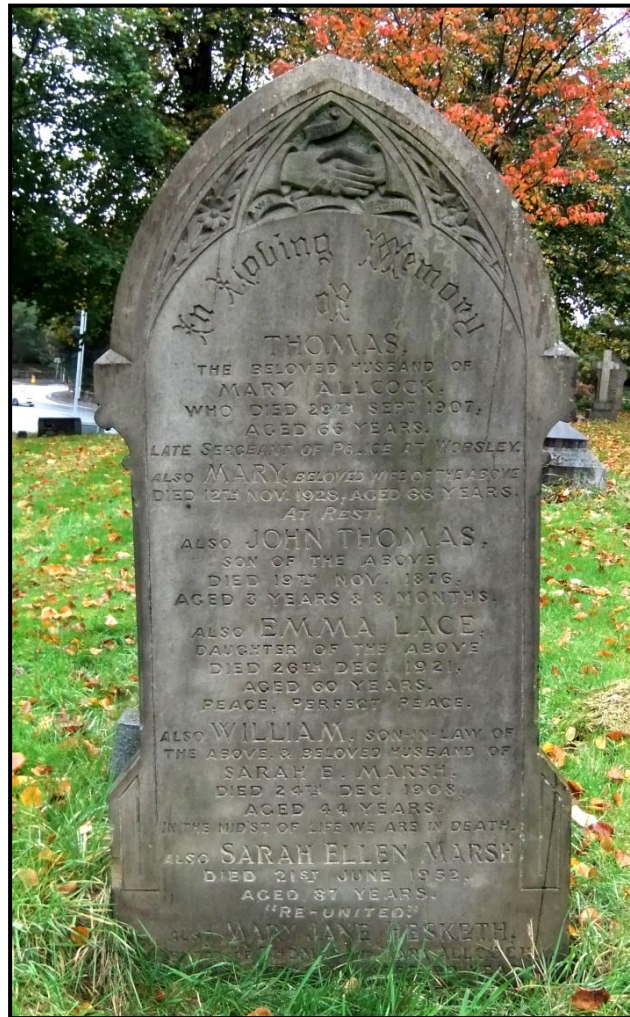

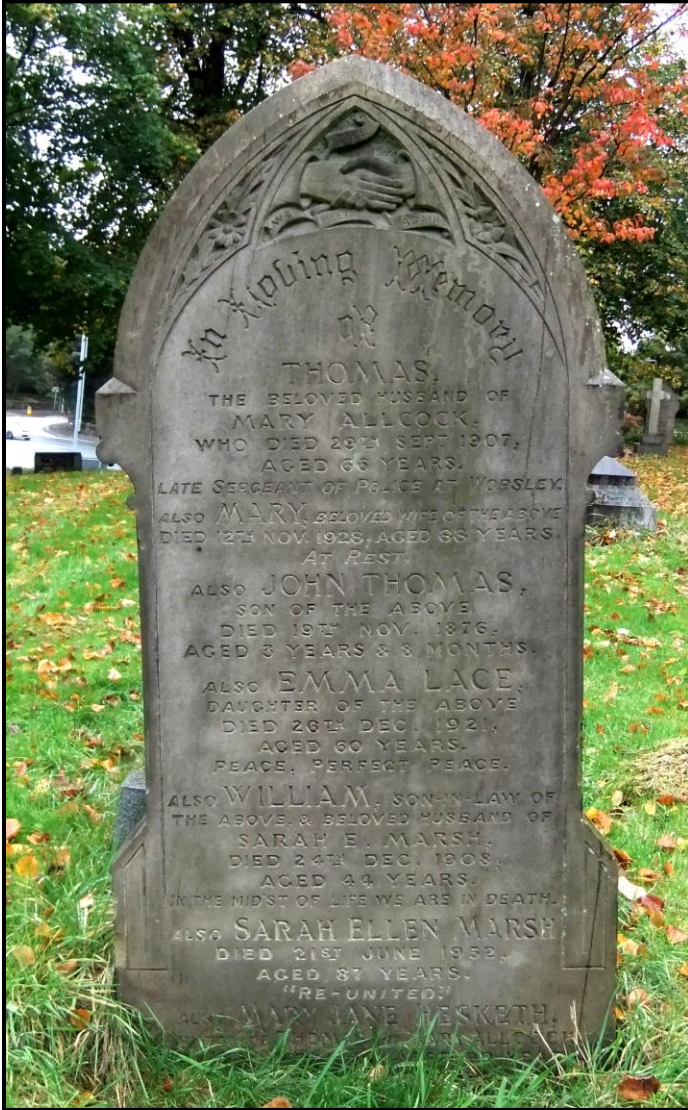

There was a Baptism for John Thomas Allcock, at St. Peter, Swinton, on 13 April **1873**. The father's occupation was Policeman. Sadly, this young boy died in November 1876.

Emma was baptised at St. Leonard, Middleton, on 19 October **1862**.

William was baptised at St. Mark, Worsley, on 1 April **1877**.

The house number 5 on Barton Road still exists today, and is locally known as *The Old Nick*.



It is now a Grade II Listed Building. The text from Historic England reads:

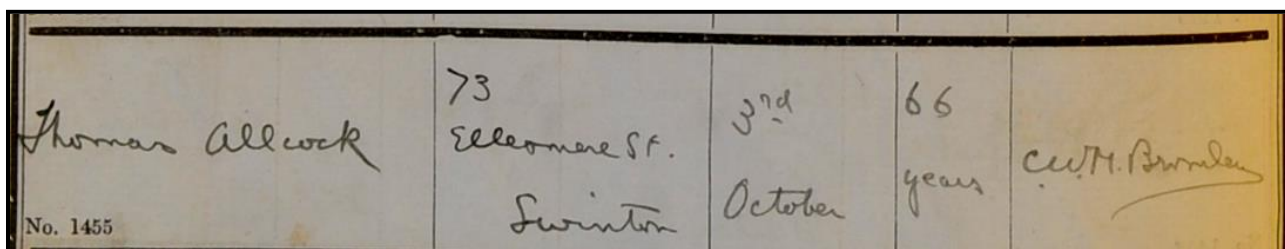
House, at one time the police house. 1851 on porch. Timber-framed with graduated stone slate roof. T-shaped plan with 3 bays, 2 storeys and a 2-storey porch to right return. Gabled porch between bays 1 and 2 with enriched barge board and finial. 3-light diamond timber mullion and transom window to right, similar but altered to left. Gabled dormer in bay 2. Bay 3 projects as a crosswing with 4-light mullion window (with transom on ground floor) on each floor. C17-style 2-storey porch to right with jettied first floor on scroll brackets. Gables to rear of bays 1 and 2. Clustered brick chimney stack.
