

*THE LATE MR. WILLIAM GRUNDY.*

*The funeral of the late Mr. William Grundy took place on Saturday at Worsley, the native place of the deceased. The coffin was placed in a special van, and conveyed by the Cheshire Lines Railway to the Exchange Station, Manchester, where it was taken over by the London and North-western train, and conveyed to Worsley. A large number of the friends of the deceased journeyed from Liverpool, Manchester and other towns, and the graveyard was crowded with sympathetic spectators. Amongst those present at the funeral were - Masters Montagu and Sidney Grundy (sons), and Miss Alice Grundy (daughter of the deceased), Mr. Jas. Grundy (brother), the Mrs. Lane (sister), Mr. J. Lane, Tamworth (brother-in-law), Mr. F. H. Millington, Thetford, Norfolk (brother-in-law), and Messrs . W Millington (chief engineer, Bridgewater Trustees), W. Kirk (station master, Central Station, Manchester, late station master at Worsley), Wallwork (coal agent, Bridgewater Trustees), E. Knowles (Shropshire Union Company, Liverpool), J. Pritchard (Manchester Ship Canal, Liverpool), W. Summerset (Leeds and Liverpool Canal, Liverpool), W. D. M<sup>c</sup>Kay (Manchester Ship Canal, Liverpool), J. Oldfield (accountant Ship Canal, Manchester), T. Chadwick (agent Ship Canal, Worsley), J. Jones (Manchester agent Ship Canal), W. Walkden (Ship Canal, Liverpool), J. Kilner (Ship Canal carting contractor, Liverpool), G. Jackson (Rochdale Canal Co.), W. H. Boddington (Carver and Co.), T. Warburton (Thompson and M<sup>c</sup>Kay, Manchester), Winstanley (C. T. Faulkner and Co., Liverpool), T. Berry (Bridgewater Trustees Walkden), W. Boyce (L. and Y. Railway, Manchester), James Evans (Ship Canal agent, Warrington), H. Tomkinson (Liverpool), J. Robinson (Birkenhead), W. Sharples (Worsley), E. Jackson (Worsley), and others. The popularity of the deceased and the great esteem in which he was held was evidenced by the thoroughly representative gathering just named, the chiefs of all the departments with which Mr. Grundy came into contact either being present or specially represented. The coffin was covered with wreaths sent from all parts of the country, and especially from Liverpool, and the service was impressively read by the Rev. F. K. Hodgkinson, vicar of the parish. In the village where the deceased was, of course, so well-known, the manifestations of sympathy and regret were universal, and the sorrowing widow and children were the subjects of general remarks of condolence.*
